






Lenape Summer Camp







Weeks 1—3 are located at Stanhope's Valley Road School.. Weeks 4—6 are located at Byram's Intermediate School.

Mon, Wed and Thurs (Week 6—Tue, Wed, Thurs) are held in the school and students rotate from one activity to another. Week 6 4—5 year olds will come to camp Tue, Wed, Thurs, Fri mornings. Activities include Art, Music, Science Exploration, Health and Wellness, Theater and Games and Outdoor Activities. All activities are presented by certified teachers and age groups are lead by college age counselors.

Tuesdays (Mon Week 6) are a full day trip. 4 and 5 year olds are welcome on the Tuesday trip on a space available basis and must be accompanied by a parent/guardian. The fee is \$40 for the child and \$45 for the adult except week 1 which is \$45 for the child and \$50 for the adult. Parents of 6—14 year olds are welcome on the Tuesday trip for a fee of \$45 (\$50 for week 1). All the above mentioned non-camp participants must register by the Monday morning of the week of the trip. Bus transportation may or may not be available.

Fridays include a 1/2 day trip in the morning followed by swimming at Hackettstown Pool for 6—14 year olds in the afternoon. Tue Aug 12 will follow the Mon schedule. Parents are welcome to join their child on the Friday morning trips for a fee of \$10, but must register in advance. Bus transportation may or may not be available. Parents may also meet the group at the pool and pay their own admission of \$5.
